Introduction

At Kingsbury Primary School we believe that a school uniform can play an important role in fostering a sense of belonging, community, and equality among our students. While we encourage students to wear a uniform for its benefits in fostering a sense of pride, unity, and readiness for learning, we understand that our children’s circumstances may make this difficult for some families. Therefore, our uniform policy aims to balance the promotion of a uniform dress code with flexibility for those who may need it.

Uniform Guidelines

We encourage children to wear the following items as part of the school uniform:

- Polo Shirt/T-Shirt: Plain, comfortable, and neutral colours.





- Trousers/Skirt: Grey or black trousers or skirts. Skirts should be of an appropriate length, just above or below the knee. Children should be able to play and learn without feeling restricted
- Sweater or Jumper: Grey, black, or navy-blue sweater or jumper. A school-branded jumper is encouraged but not required.
- Footwear: Plain black shoes. Trainers or boots are acceptable if they are black, clean, and in good condition.
- Tights/Socks: Black or grey tights or plain socks.

Hair and Accessories

- Hair: Students are encouraged to keep their hair neat and tidy. Extreme hairstyles (such as brightly coloured or shaved patterns) are discouraged, but we respect individual expression.
- Jewellery: Students are expected not to wear jewellery.
- Makeup: No makeup is to be worn

Non-Uniform Days

We recognise that there are occasions throughout the year when students may be invited to participate in non-uniform days or special events. On these days, students should wear clothes that are appropriate for the school environment, keeping in mind that the dress should reflect the values of our school community (e.g., no offensive language or inappropriate images).

Flexibility and Inclusivity

We acknowledge that not all families have the same resources, and some students may find it difficult to afford uniform items. While we encourage a school uniform, we are committed to supporting families in need. If there are financial constraints or if wearing the uniform presents a personal difficulty, please contact the school office or the pastoral team. We are happy to discuss possible support, including second-hand uniforms or other accommodations.





Encouraging Uniform Participation

While the school encourages the wearing of the uniform as part of our community spirit, we also believe in the importance of personal choice.

Uniform Expectations

On days when students choose not to wear the uniform, we ask that their clothing is appropriate for a school setting:

- No clothing that features offensive slogans, logos, or images.
- Clothing should be suitable for learning and play.
- Clothing should be comfortable but respectful of the school environment.
